GENERAL NEWS

From the Parish Council

Meetings of the Council resumed in July and will continue on their scheduled day of the second Monday of the month at 7.00 p.m. They will take place at the Parish Centre unless there are further interruptions caused by the pandemic.

The Parish Centre has re-opened, but use is restricted primarily to the main hall with a capacity of 20 people and limited activities to ensure that social distancing rules can be complied with. Only very small gatherings will be permitted in the meeting room.

The **playgrounds** are proving popular now that they are re-opened. Unfortunately, it's noticeable that not everyone is complying with the guidance notes on the entrance gates and website when using the playgrounds. These are designed for your safety and the safety of others to comply with the Government's guidance. Use of playgrounds cannot be risk free from Covid-19 but the guidance notes are intended to minimise that risk as much as practicable so please -

- If the playground is busy, consider returning later
- Limit groups to no more than 6 people and 1 child on each piece of equipment at a time
- Maintain social distancing
- Use sanitiser or wipes to clean children's hands before and after use.
- Clean surfaces before and after use, essential if clinically vulnerable
- Avoid touching your face
- Dispose of waste in the bins provided or preferably take your rubbish home
- No food or drink allowed
- Don't use the playground if displaying signs or symptoms of coronavirus
- Children's clothes should be washed when returning home

Following the invitation of quotations, the Council has appointed a firm of architects to design a **replacement for the Parish Centre** which will be located on the site of the existing Centre car park. A consultation exercise will be undertaken in the coming months to obtain the views of the community on the design.

It had been hoped that the **75**th **anniversary of VJ Day** on 15 August could be commemorated more fully than was possible for VE Day75 but the ongoing restrictions on social distancing has meant that this will also be limited primarily to recordings on the Council's website and facebook accounts.

Warboys Library

Will reopen on Tuesday 4 August 10am to 2pm. The reduced opening hours will be Tuesdays 10am-2pm and Thursdays 2-6pm.

Using the library

It isn't possible to freely browse the shelves at the moment. Books can be borrowed using our new Select and Collect Service or by placing a reservation on a specific title. You can choose titles according to your preferences (e.g. genre, fiction, non-fiction, talking books, children's books etc.) and then collect them from any of the open libraries. We encourage all our customers to wear face masks and have hand sanitizer freely available for their use.

- To reserve a specific title or to order a book using the Select and Collect service visit https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/residents/libr aries-leisure-culture/libraries or call the Customer Service Centre on 0345 045 5225. Both services are completely free to use at present. Customers will be notified when their books are ready to collect.
- Return items at any open library
- Our IT facilities are back up and available for 45 minute customer appointments which can be made over the phone via the Customer Service Centre or online.
- Printing facility- exact cash only, card payments at Cambridge Central, Huntingdon and Wisbech libraries

Whilst it's great to have our libraries open again, we appreciate that it is still short of the full offer customers are used to. We are keeping things under continual review and will resume the full service as soon as it is possible to do so safely. See also page 6 for more about the Library at Home.

We have also started to offer online Storytime and Rhymetime. Do tune in and you will see some familiar library faces! Staff are also taking to the internet with online craft sessions for children.



Message from the Moat House Surgery

We would like to thank our patients for their ongoing support in these unprecedented times. It remains a challenging time for everyone providing healthcare and all our appointments will continue to be 'remote by default'. All initial consultations will be with a GP or Nurse by telephone, if the clinician feels you need to be seen then they will invite you for a face to face appointment either at the surgery or by video link. We would respectfully like to remind patients that when attending the surgery for appointments you do not bring any additional family members unless they are needed for support or care.

We are following government guidelines in relation to face coverings and ask that when entering the surgery, a face covering/mask is worn. WADS kindly donated some of their face masks, so we are able to give these to those patients who don't have a covering (whilst stocks last). We would like to say a big thank you to WADS for making these for us.

We will be having an extended flu campaign this yearit will be different to previous years and we are currently in the process of working out the best way to provide this to the extended target group of around 3500 of our patients. We hope to start the flu vaccinations in mid to late September (depending on when the vaccines are available) and will aim to have everyone vaccinated if possible, by the end of the year. We will be sending appointment letters out but if you haven't received one by mid-September please contact the surgery. We would be grateful if you would arrive as close as possible to your appointment time, with your arm ready to be immunised (minimal layers of clothing and sleeves easily rolled to the shoulder). There will be information on the Childrens' Flu Campaign in the next Diary.

Warboys Amateur Dramatics Mask-r-Aid update

In the middle of May "For the love of Scrubs" started to make face masks for farm workers and the elderly in Ramsey. WADS wanted to support the villagers of Warboys just as they have supported WADS over the last 30 years. They decided to make masks/face coverings and donate these freely to the vulnerable and shielding in the village. Sara our costume designer and maker did lots of research to ensure the coverings met recommended safety and design standards and then our machinists, Sara, Beryl, Lissa, Manda and Eden began production.

We were secretly aiming for making 500 masks. By 4 June we had reached 1000 and then we opened up our offer to anyone who needed a mask. We ended up delivering to Wistow, Broughton, Old Hurst and even Pidley! Four

masks even got posted to Hunstanton.



We delivered masks to the surgery, the dentist, Wards the Chemist, Windmill Bakery, Spar, De Ramsey and Ashleigh Courts and the Baptist Church. All donations received were used to buy elastic and filters, On the 19 July our production line finally ceased, and our **final total was 2450 masks**. We have compiled two folders full of thank you messages and cards from you all.

It has been great to see our masks around the village! I hope you are all getting in the habit of

tucking that mask in your handbag or pocket whenever you leave the home. Leave one in the car. **Stay safe and take care. from WADS.**

I reach the clock tower. A beautiful landmark in memory of a great woman. No, not me, Queen Victoria, although my image proudly sits on top of this, in the form of a weather vane. I am honoured to be remembered in the same way as a great Queen.

My beautiful village, my home has seen so many things over the years. Much of what was there when I was is long gone. Fire, famine and plague to name just a few events. But so much good too. Beautiful buildings replaced our old shacks. Warboys is a good place now. Residents now are not persecuted as I was. Warboys is my happy place.

Warboys will always be my home. I am Alice Samuel, the alleged witch of Warboys. I am grateful that my memory is still here, in this place.


