
AN UPDATE AND A MESSAGE FROM THE MOAT HOUSE SURGERY

Flu Clinics

This year we ran two walk-in flu vaccination clinics which were very well attended. We still have stock of the Over 65 vaccine, so if you are 65 or over and not yet had the vaccine please call the appointment line and we will get you booked in. We are

expecting a delivery of 240 Under 65 vaccines at the end of November. We will send texts and advertise on our website once these have arrived so that patients under 65 will be able to book in.



COVID Infections



Cambridgeshire and Peterborough are still seeing fairly high levels of COVID infections as well as a lot of other colds and viruses. If you have any symptoms including high temperature, continuous cough, headache, loss of taste/smell, sore throat, congestion and sickness or diarrhoea, please book a PCR test online https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test-or-by-calling-119. Lateral Flow Tests are only for asymptomatic people.

You can still book your COVID-19 vaccine appointments online or by calling 119, or you can walk in for your jab at a walk-in site - go to www.thevaccinators.co.uk to see the full

list. We are unable to make these appointments at the surgery.

Moat House Surgery is part of the St Ives Primary Care Network and this has enabled us to have a number of news roles at the surgery, including a Physiotherapist (Michelle), Clinical Pharmacists (Adam and Anwar), Social Prescribing Link Worker (Heather) and a Care Coordinator (Vickie).

Warboys pupils race to the finish in mini-London Marathon

Pupils from Warboys Primary Academy enjoyed a fun and active start to November by taking part in a sponsored mini-London Marathon around the village. The run was organised by the school as part of the official London Marathon event and all children receive a London Marathon pin badge and certificate for taking part.

From the smallest reception children up to competitive Year 6, every child had the opportunity to participate in the mini-marathon by completing a 2.6-mile route - either running, walking or a combination of both! As well as being a fun team event for the children, and a great way to get lots of fresh air and exercise, the **children also raised more than £1,600 through sponsorship - an amazing achievement**! The money raised will be put towards our new playground equipment

The pupils all had a fantastic time and it gave them a flavour of what running the official London Marathon might be like! Thank you to all the children for taking part, to their parents and families for their enthusiasm, generous donations and being race marshals and group supervisors and to our local community for their support.

NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

Following the low-key event due to the pandemic in 2020, the **Remembrance Sunday** service at the War Memorial on 14 November attracted a huge number of people to pay their respects to the nation's fallen in past conflicts. The service was led by the Rev. Garry Dawson-Jones, with wreaths laid by representatives of village organisations and RAF Wyton and commemorative crosses placed by children of the uniformed organisations in the village.



The success of **the week-long holiday sports club for children** in August funded by the Council with support from the Whittome Wind Trust has led the Council to budget for a further event in 2022. This will be extended to two weeks with attendance increased to 25 children per day who live in the Parish. A small charge of £5 per child per day will be made next year to help deter 'no-shows' on the day which occurred from time to time in August when places that had been booked were left unfilled by children who didn't arrive. Further details on how to book will be announced nearer the time.

An accident involving a car late on the evening of 6 November has resulted in one of the **ornamental lighting columns**, **electricity feeder unit and a bollard being damaged at the Jubilee Clock Tower**. Balfour Beatty, who carry out the lighting maintenance contract for the Parish Council, removed the damaged units within 48 hours but it will mean that the lights around the Clock Tower will be without power until the insurers give the go-ahead for the replacement. Sadly, this includes the Christmas lighting display which is always such a striking feature around the Tower. Balfour Beatty are ready to undertake the necessary works as soon approval is obtained from the insurers and although this won't be until after the official lights switch-on on 27 November, it's hoped that the festive lighting will be on display before Christmas.

The planning application for the **replacement of the Parish Centre** is now being considered by the local planning authority and comments have been invited from statutory consultees and residents living nearby. The outcome is expected in the next few months.

CELEBRATING THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE Thursday 2 June – Sunday 5 June 2022

Warboys, along with the rest of the nation, will be celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Community Association and the Parish Council are planning a range of events and activities to mark this landmark occasion.

You need to remember that the usual Spring Bank holiday at the end of May has been moved to Thursday 2 June and we have an extra Platinum Jubilee bank holiday on Friday 3 June The Council has been funding a **Timebank scheme** in Warboys

for the past 5 years, with a part-time Co-ordinator employed by the Council itself. The departure of the previous Co-ordinator in September enabled the Council to review the performance of the scheme. The venture has been slow to develop in Warboys and while it has no doubt

helped some within the community, it has never achieved the impact that was anticipated at the outset. The Council has therefore decided not to replace the Co-ordinator and to withdraw funding for the scheme. It's open to Timebank members to continue the scheme if they wish to do so on a voluntary basis.

Take extra home safety precautions

Most burglaries are a result of a thief spotting an opportunity and although the police continue to target burglars and bring offenders to justice, often a lack of security, empty homes and the cover of darkness is all the invitation a thief looks for. Simple things like installing good interior and exterior lighting, used together with timer switches or motion sensors, keeping valuables hidden and entry points secure are all ways to put off a burglar. Other advice includes:

- Closing your blinds or curtains at night to prevent people from looking into your home
- Not leaving spare keys hidden outside a burglar may look for these first
- Not leaving car keys near the front door or anywhere easy to find
- Installing a driveway alarm
- Installing a visible burglar alarm



Warboys Art Group Autumn Exhibition Resumes

After a two year wait because of COVID-19, the Warboys Art Group was at last able to hold its autumn exhibition on the 30 and 31 of October in the Sports and Social Club. During the pandemic most of the group's artists have been busy painting, some more than others. A few have found that the lack of regular meetings dampened their enthusiasm to paint particularly as the stimulus of the exhibition was missing last year -this is always a catalyst to produce new works.

In all over 140 pictures were on display covering a wide range of subjects from animals to landscapes, seascapes, abstract, to flowers, still life and people, painted in oils, acrylics, watercolours, pastels and pen and ink. Karen Shipton, John Parsons Tony Greenstock and Dave Woosey in particular have been very active over the past 18 months displaying around 40 pictures between them. Also, during the exhibition Mick Mitchell demonstrated painting two sunset scenes in oils attracting many favourable comments.

Over the two days more than 100 people attended the exhibition with one lady from Whittlesey being especially impressed - "the exhibition was well worth visiting and was thoroughly enjoyable" She also praised the high standard of work singling out some of the artists that particularly impressed her.

As with previous exhibitions, entrance was free but donations in support of Breast Cancer UK and Cancer Research UK were requested and resulted in over £170 being collected.

Warboys is a vibrant community with a considerable number of very active groups and


organisations. Nearly all of these groups rely on a team of volunteers to help them achieve their objectives.

Letter to the Editor

I have been a resident of the village for nearly 20 years and from the day we moved in received a warm welcome and friendliness from everyone we met. Walking round the village usually involves stopping to pass the time of day, and over the years there have been 2 topics that come up in conversation and these have been the sad neglect of Newman's Stores and the state of the pavements.

Newman's Stores has at long last been purchased and is now subject to a planning application for conversion to residential accommodation and I hope that it will be sympathetic to retaining the facade. With the growth in population that has taken place with the new housing around the village, I had hoped that it would be opened as a restaurant that would complement the White Hart and Royal Oak, both of whom are regularly fully booked.

The state of the pavements particularly in the High Street is a disgrace. In the past I have spoken with Roy Reeves and understand that the Parish Council has little or no influence on road and footpath upkeep, and that it is higher authorities that are responsible for carrying this out. There have been some minor repairs around the village but as far as I am aware nothing of note has been done in the High Street. It is clear that without pressure from within the village, this state of affairs will continue until someone has a fall on the really bad section from Amar's shop up to the bakery and successfully sues the relevant authority. I believe that the only way apart from an accident that nobody wants is for a petition to be started and I would ask through the Warboys Diary for anyone with experience of raising and running a petition to step forward. Personally, I would be happy to help but lack the knowledge to

A reply from Roy Reeves

'Cambridgeshire County Council are the highway authority responsible for the condition of all highways in the village that have been adopted as maintainable at the public expense. This includes both the carriageways and the footways. Mr Dale is correct in pointing out that many of the footways are in poor condition and need resurfacing. The County Council do have a maintenance budget but this is insufficient for what's needed due to a lack of funding and other pressures on their budget.'


