# **NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL**

#### **Proposed Development at Station Road**

News was received from Huntingdonshire District Council in November that they were planning to dispose of a field in Station Road to a registered housing group for the development of affordable housing. This came as a surprise as the land is not allocated for development in the Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036 which was adopted in May 2019. The Parish Council alerted local people to the proposal and arranged a public meeting held electronically in December at which representatives of the District Council and the housing group explained what was intended.

Having learnt that the site is being regarded as a 'windfall' site by the District Council, the Parish Council has decided to obtain independent planning advice on the implications of the proposal. As capacity at the Parish Centre is limited by the pandemic and Council meetings must be held face-to-face, the Council will be making special

arrangements to consider the planning application. The Council intends to call another public meeting electronically to enable those people who wish to comment on the application to be able to do so and to invite a limited number of representatives of the public to attend a meeting of the Planning Committee to formulate the Parish Council's response to the District Council.

# Purchase of Land Adjoining the A141

The purchase of land adjoining the A141 and frequented for many years by the public with the consent of the owner was completed just before Christmas. Grants have been obtained by the Parish Council that will offset approximately 90% of the purchase price from Red Tile Wind Farm Trust Fund, Huntingdonshire District Council's central Community

#### **Play Equipment**

The musical chimes damaged by vandalism at Adams Lyons playground were replaced in January following a successful claim against the Council's insurance policy.

The pick-up-sticks play equipment that had to be removed at Jubilee Park due to the condition of the timber logs will be replaced shortly by a new multi-use item of play equipment for younger children, 50% of the cost of which will be met by a grant from the Whittome Wind Trust.

Infrastructure Levy funds and funding from the Croftholme Close development for the provision of off-site public open space.

A working party will be meeting a representative of the Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, and Northamptonshire Wildlife Trust later in the month to discuss the future management of the land and an application for funding to improve the footpath crossing of the A141 to access the land will be considered by the County Council later in the spring. We will keep you updated about progress.

# Council Tax 2022/23

Having decided to replace the Parish Centre with a new village hall at the rear of the existing building, the Parish Council will be seeking further grant opportunities and a loan to help fund the capital cost which is likely to exceed £1 million. However, the Council has also found it necessary to increase its precept or share of the Council Tax by 5% in the coming year. This is equivalent to £4.05 per annum for a property in Band D or just under 8 pence per week. Despite the increase the parish precept for Warboys is still likely to be one of the smallest of the larger towns and parishes in Huntingdonshire.

Although only recently elected as District Councillor, I know from

personal experience as a resident of our ward that speeding and HGVs travelling through the village are two of the problems that impact on our quality of life.

Just before Christmas, I contacted Stephen Green to see how I can help. Stephen runs the Warboys Speedwatch Group and sits on the Warboys Parish Council. We had a very productive meeting discussing the issues and how best to tackle them on behalf of residents. It was agreed that the first step should be for

me to meet with representatives from the Huntingdonshire Police Force, who are tasked to deal with these problems and appointments have already been made for later this month. I am also hoping to bring the Police and Crime Commissioner here to Warboys in the very near future to see, first-hand, the suffering caused by drivers speeding through the village and by HGVs who, through no fault of the drivers, are having to use completely unacceptable village roads.


# LOOKING AFTER YOURSELF AND OTHERS

# A MESSAGE FROM THE MOAT HOUSE SURGERY ABOUT REPEAT PRESCRIPTION ORDERING

I have been part of the Moat House Team for nearly 17 years and the volume of requests for repeat prescriptions has never been greater. On a daily basis, we often receive over 100 emails from patients asking for their repeat medication. After a weekend or Bank Holiday, we can exceed 200 requests, not including paper requests in the post boxes.

We process these as quickly as we can and aim to clear the requests on the day but we do ask for 72 working hours before patients can expect to collect medication from their chosen pharmacy. We have noticed that many of the patients who order using email have already set up their online patient access through the NHS App or with a passcode from us at the surgery.

#### We would ask that these patients use their online access to order their repeat medication instead of emailing.




If you wish to set up this facility, please either collect a form from reception and bring in two forms of ID, one of which should be photographic and the other proof of your address. Alternatively, you can use the NHS App and then you do not need to visit the surgery, just follow the simple steps on the app. Once you have access this will allow you to get your COVID Pass, order repeat prescriptions, book appointments, view your health record, results, and more, please click on the link for more information. https://www.nhs.uk/nhs-app/about-the-nhs-app/

The Warboys Christmas Lighting Group have been busy over the past couple of months putting together a festive set of displays around

the village. Despite not being able to hold fund raising events due to the COVID restrictions imposed, the group were able to purchase new Christmas Tree lights and a Nordmann Fir Christmas Tree following many generous contributions from Warboys residents and businesses including Stephen Cole surfacing, the Warboys Community Association, Swannells Transport and donations from Blakemore and Warboys Community Bonfire. The attractive contrasting display of coloured tree lights and fir tree were requested by village residents.

Greener Futures have been concerned for many years about the effects of climate change. We have campaigned to get energy advice available within the village including solar panels and improved insulation. We are all becoming aware of the problems created by using fossil fuels – coal, oil, gas, etc. and the predictions that these polluting systems will be phased out.

Now we are all seeing the spiralling bills costs of energy into our homes, and the difficulties of getting independent advice. Consequently, we need advice on what help is available to households suffering fuel poverty. Also, advice on the newer, more efficient, systems like heat pumps. It is becoming clear that many of us will have to change our energy sources in the coming years.

#### An Energy Advice Drop-in session will take place on Thursday 17 February between 3pm and 7pm in the Sports Social Club, Forge Way.


We have organised for PECT, an environmental charity, to provide advisers. They will give advice on how to get help with fuel poverty and on alternative, more sustainable, energy sources

#HuntsWasteBusters looks at what makes up our landfilled waste. In 2020, Huntingdonshire residents sent over 29,000 tonnes of waste to the landfill. Much of this could have been directed elsewhere. Recycling, reusing, and composting are the keys to cutting our waste footprint.

In 2019 the council completed a waste analysis. They found that over 70% of the contents could have avoided the landfill. Our blue bins can take a lot more items than you might expect and the council can

# **HIGHWAY CODE CHANGES FOR 2022**



# Make sure you stay up to date (and avoid fines and points)

An update to The Highway Code has introduced a hierarchy of road users, which creates 'clearer and stronger priorities' for pedestrians. The Department for Transport claims that the changes, which are split into three main rules, ultimately aim to improve safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and horse riders. A recent AA survey suggests one in three drivers are unaware of these major changes to road rules which **came into force on 29 January.** 

#### Key points can be summarised as follows

The advances of large passenger vehicles and HGVs now have 'the greatest responsibility to reduce the danger posed to other road users'

- Drivers at a junction should give way to pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross a road that they're turning into
- Drivers should give way to pedestrians waiting to cross a zebra crossing, and pedestrians and cyclists waiting to cross a parallel crossing
- Cyclists should give way to pedestrians that are using shared-use cycle tracks Drivers should not cut across cyclists going ahead when turning into or out of a junction or changing direction or lane
- New 'Dutch Reach' technique tells road users how to open the door of their vehicle while looking over their shoulder

### The Old Village Board School Trust (OVBST)

The OVBST was formed when the site of the old school (where the library is currently located) was sold off and the school transferred to the new site in Humberdale Way. Some of the money was invested and the interest from that money can be used to give small grants to young people from Warboys to help with their education. Young people must live within the parish of Warboys or within half a mile of the parish boundary and should be aged less than 25 years. Grants can be used

- for the purchase of special educational materials like books or equipment for College or University
- to buy special tools needed by someone who is undergoing special training or starting out in a trade or craft
- to purchase special sporting equipment or musical instruments
- for educational travel to broaden the education and experience of young people
- to allow young people to undergo special training courses that may not otherwise be available to them

It can also be used by school and youth groups, <u>e.g.</u> sports, religious or uniformed groups in the Warboys area to provide equipment to further the education and development of local young people.


