NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

Proposed Development at Station Road

A planning application has been submitted by the Longhurst Housing Group to build 48 affordable homes on land owned by Huntingdonshire District Council in Station Road. The Parish Council is aware of local concerns about the development and has engaged Cheffins of Cambridge, a firm of expert planning consultants to advise on their response. As soon as their report is available, a special meeting of the Council's Planning Committee will be held to respond to the application. Notification will be given of the date of the meeting as soon as this is known, and the members of the public will have an opportunity to air their views before the application is discussed by the Committee. Details of the application (reference 22/00412/FUL) can be found on the District Council's website and any comments on the application should be sent to that authority.

Election

In common with many other parish councils in Huntingdonshire, there were insufficient candidates for a contested election to be held on 5 May. Two councillors decided not to stand for re-election, and one already had resigned in March, so the twelve remaining councillors were elected unopposed plus one new councillor, Ambrose Ntuk.

An expression of interest which has yet to be considered has been received to fill one of the two remaining vacancies, but this means that at least one vacancy remains. This is being advertised again in the hope that a full complement of 15 councillors can be achieved.

Onyetts Field - Land Adjoining the A141

The Parish Council's bid for funding by the highway authority, Cambridgeshire County Council, to improve the safety of the public footpath crossing of the A141 to access Onyetts Field and the footpath network beyond has scored equal third highest out of 42 bids for schemes in Huntingdonshire in 2022/23. The Parish Council will have to pay £6,200 or just over 25% of the cost but there is a backlog of schemes to be implemented by the County's highways officers and the final cost may be higher as inflation continues to take effect.

Climate and Environment Strategy

The Council has adopted a Climate and Environment Strategy in response to the climate emergency that has been declared both nationally and, more locally, by Cambridgeshire Council. The Council will be seeking both to reduce its impact on the environment and to work with the community to encourage positive change. Consultation will be taking place on the


adoption of an seeking to create a liaison grou

Action Plan and the Council will be seeking to create a liaison group to work with the Council on its development and implementation.

Sports Holiday Club

A sports holiday club for children living in the Parish will be funded by the Council and Whittome Wind Trust again in the school summer holidays at the primary academy. This year's club will be open for longer at 2 weeks, starting on 1 August from 9.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. each weekday. There will be a nominal charge of £5 per day for up to 25 children. The club will be organised by Finding Fitness of Stamford again on the Council's behalf after the success of 2021 and an opportunity to register is now available.

Replacement Parish Centre: The application for planning permission for the replacement of the Parish Centre which was submitted to the local planning authority last September appears to have been bogged down by changes in personnel at the District Council. Following a request for a report on progress, it seems that consultations have been undertaken internally by planning officers which have not generated any fundamental concerns with the application and hopefully planning permission will be granted before much longer.



New Cloud Based Telephone System

We are always looking at ways of improving patient access to our service and will soon be installing a new cloud-based telephone system. One of the many new features will be the 'queue call back' facility, which in busy periods, will mean that you no longer need to hang on the phone waiting and that we will call you straight back when a receptionist is available. The phone system will be connected to our computer system and will automatically bring up the patient details when a call is received, this will maximise efficiency. Please remember that phoning the surgery is only one of many ways to contact us, you are able to sign up to 'on line services' to book routine appointments and order prescriptions, download the NHS App to your mobile phone, Dr Link via our website, or send an email to:- <u>moat.house@nhs.net</u>

Community Pharmacy Consultation Service

Moat House Surgery, in conjunction with Wards of Warboys Pharmacy, can now offer the national Community Pharmacy Consultation Service. Our team at the surgery will ask a series of questions to establish the best route for your call. Patients with minor illnesses could be offered a personal consultation with the local pharmacist. Pharmacists are highly trained healthcare professionals with 5 years training who spend a high percentage of their time helping patients with

minor illnesses. The information given to the surgery will be forwarded to the pharmacy who will aim to ring back within two hours. If needed the pharmacist may ask you to attend the chemist for a personal consultation and medication might be advised. If the pharmacist is unable to help, you will be referred back to the surgery for either a same day or routine appointment, depending on the advice of the pharmacist. This additional service is aimed at improving access to care and we hope that you will all find it useful.

Evening & Weekend Appointments

Moat House Surgery is open between 7:30am and 6pm Monday to Friday. However, if you are unable to attend the surgery to see a doctor, nurse, or health care assistant, between these times, we can offer evening or weekend appointments at any one of the Primary Care hubs located in St. Ives, Huntingdon, Ramsey, Buckden, Little Paxton, Eaton Socon, St Neots or March. Please speak with our reception team to book an appointment.

Patient Participation Group (PPG)

We are pleased to inform you of the new Patient Participation Group (PPG) which gives the opportunity for the surgery team and patients to meet on a quarterly basis, to discuss practice issues and patient experience to help improve the service. 



Ramsey Model Aero Club by Jonathan Land

During your walks in and around Warboys Village, I am sure many of you will have seen model aircraft flying in the middle of the Old Warboys Airfield. **The Ramsey Model Aero Club** has been established at the Warboys Site since 1984.

Historically, the Club was formed at RAF Upwood during the 1970s - hence the Club's association with Ramsey. However, when



RAF Upwood closed, the Club was forced to look for an alternative site. Fortunately, Farmer John Stokes of Warboys and the then Club Chairman, also called John

Stokes, had close local ties through a mutual community association. Subsequently, Farmer John Stokes proposed an area in the middle of Warboys Airfield for the Club to use to fly model aircraft. Since WW2 the site had been used for agriculture, so a significant effort was made by the then RMAC members to de-stone the site, seed it roll it and turn it into the fantastic permanent facility that we all enjoy today. Thirty-eight years later the 7-acre site is maintained to a very high standard by the membership and, as they say, the rest is history!

The RMAC has around 160 members; many local to the Warboys area, but with a few more extending out into Cambridgeshire and beyond. We fly all types of models ranging from Gas Turbine powered aircraft, Scale, Aerobatic and Gliders. We are a British Model Flying Association ('BMFA') affiliated Club, and we operate a BMFA flying training scheme to ensure all members can fly competently and, moreover, safely before they are allowed to fly unsupervised.

The Club is renowned as one of the best flying sites in the UK and we have hosted numerous National Aerobatic, Scale and Gliding competitions. Furthermore, many of you may have visited our Open Days where we have



demonstrated model jet displays, WW2 aircraft and all aspects of our hobby. Unfortunately, our Open Days have been curtailed in recent years due to COVID, but I am sure we will bring them back in the future.

On a more serious note, safety is the Club's main priority; both to our membership and most certainly the public. We are acutely aware that we have a public footpath adjacent to the north and west of our flying site. Model aircraft are potentially dangerous; therefore, we have an obligation to ensure that persons walking

nearby the flying field are at a safe distance from any flying models. You will see that we have erected signs restricting public access to the private road to the East and South of our flying field. We respectfully request that all walkers stay on the public footpath where we can see people and ensure we keep our models at a safe distance from them and keep everyone safe.

The Ramsey Model Aero Club is very proud of its association with Warboys Village - we have supported numerous village fetes and events, including presentations at local schools and recently the Warboys Scout Group. We are always looking to introduce new people to our hobby - so if you are interested in learning more about building and flying model aircraft please come and see us at the Club or visit our website at -<u>www.ramseymac.com</u>. 


