COMMUNITY NEWS

Following the sad passing of Queen Elizabeth, the Council is grateful to the people of Warboys for the compassion shown in memory of the Queen at this difficult time. Although Her Majesty had clearly been in failing health during her Jubilee year, the news of her death came as a huge shock, and it seems inconceivable that she is no longer with us.

Over 450 entries were made in the Book of Condolence opened in her memory at the SPAR, many of which were signed on behalf of partners and families. The Council is grateful to all those who volunteered to oversee the Book while it was open and also to the management of the SPAR for allowing it to be available at the entrance to the store. A separate Book was also opened at the Church of St Mary Magdalene and there's no knowing how many signed a Book of Remembrance available on-line.

Thanks are extended also to all those who laid flowers around the village flagpole at the Weir. These were carefully removed by the Chair of the Council on the morning after the funeral and any messages left will be retained with the Book of Condolence.

A well-attended and very moving Service of Thanksgiving was conducted by Rev Garry Dawson-Jones at the Church on the eve of Her Majesty's funeral.

Warboys also played its part in the accession of King Charles with the Royal Proclamation read by the Chair of the Parish Council outside the Library with representatives of village groups and about 70 members of the community present to witness this momentous occasion.

Proposed Development at Station Road

Nothing further has been heard recently about the planning application by the Longhurst Housing Group to build 48 affordable homes on land owned by Huntingdonshire District Council in Station Road. It seems likely that the application will be determined by the District Council Development Management Committee but the date of the meeting when it will be heard has yet to be announced. It's likely that there will only be a few days' notice of the meeting, but the District Council should be contacting those who have made representations to make them aware.

Field during August finally was successful with both ponds being topped up with mains water. At The Weir, Cambridge Water agreed to hire the Council a standpipe that enabled water to be taken from a nearby washout,

A Weir update from Joan Cole

16 inches of water was added to the Weir, using a standpipe in the village. There wasn't any charge for the water, just for the hire of the standpipe. When the depth of the Weir reached 3ft, the aerator ran continually to mix the cold mains water with the warmer Weir water. Most fish have been saved and the volume of water is now at a level that doesn't need to be monitored every day at 4.30am. fortunately without any charge for the water used. And at Onyetts Field, a local farmer managed to pump water over some distance to fill the pond.

The Warboys Speedwatch Group has not been active during the August holiday period and we have only just restarted sessions. However, they really would like additional volunteers.
