

THE QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY

Shortly before Christmas, Members of the Parish Council planted an oak tree at Onyetts Field to commemorate the long reign and service to the nation of the late Queen Elizabeth II. Although it had originally been intended to plant a tree to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the long dry summer was not the time to be planting and events then took a different turn in September. The new tree has been registered as part of the Queen's Green Canopy in accordance with Her Majesty's wishes for planting to commemorate the 70 years of her reign.

The Council is grateful to Andrew Swannell for sourcing and providing the oak without charge and for his continuing generosity to the community of Warboys.

Volunteers also helped the Council's Handymen in planting a new hedge supplied by the Wildlife Trust at Onyetts Field to provide autumn nuts and fruits for local wildlife which has also been registered as part of the Queen's Green Canopy.

If you search for them on the QGC website, you'll find that the pins are placed randomly on the map within a 1 km radius to anonymise the location.

WARBOYS PARISH CENTRE - HIRE CHARGES

The Parish Council has been reviewing the charges for the hire of the Parish Centre. The current contracts for the supply of electricity and gas will end in February and March respectively and early indications are that there will be a huge increase in the cost per unit for both types of energy. To recover the additional expenditure would have required a significant increase in the hire charge.

The Parish Centre is used by many community groups with limited resources and the Council recognise that any increase in the charges of the scale required could have a damaging effect on the financial viability of those groups. The Council has therefore decided to absorb the additional energy costs without increasing the hourly rate, especially as the new Parish Centre which is being planned will be far more energy efficient that the current building.

However, there will need to be a small increase in the first hour of use to meet increased staffing costs and, with effect from the beginning of January, the first hour of use for the Hall will increase by £1 to £16 and for the Meeting Room by a similar amount to £11. The subsequent hourly rate will remain unchanged at £9 and £6 per hour respectively.

Repeat Prescriptions

If you require a repeat prescription, please allow five working days (this does not include weekends or bank holidays). Repeat prescription requests can be made in many different ways:

- by returning the computerised repeat slip by post or in person, If you wish your prescription posting back, please include a stamped addressed envelope.
- emailing the Surgery at moat.house@nhs.net
- If you are a dispensing patient, please email cpicb.moathousedispensary@nhs.net
- via our website. Registration is required for this method 2 forms of I.D. are required, one photo ID and proof of your home address.

Hospital Waiting Times

As you will be aware from media information, hospital waiting times can be lengthy. Due to the volume of referrals made by the surgery we request that you do not contact us to chase routine hospital appointments unless you have waited longer than 12 weeks or the date shown on your referral information letter. If you have been referred for an urgent hospital appointment or a "2 week wait" appointment and have not heard about an appointment within 14 days, please contact the surgery.

Physiotherapist

We continue to have an in-house physiotherapist. Our receptionists are highly trained and will listen to your explanations and requirements and may well direct you to our physio Michelle Newton. She is at the surgery on a Tuesday and Wednesday and will either see patients for a face-to-face appointment or a telephone consultation.

WARBOYS LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

We were entertained by Roger Leivers on 5 December talking about Godmanchester at War. He has written several books, the proceeds of which and his lecture fees are donated to a trust. So far, some £33K has been distributed to good causes. He talked of several individuals who lost their lives in WW2, in particular Francis Sanders who happened to be riding his bike by Wyton when there was a bomb being loaded onto a Lancaster which slipped and exploded, destroying the plane and killing poor Francis who was just passing by. Roger talked of the evacuees, some of whom stayed on and some returned because they liked Godmanchester and preferred it to the East End of London. More recent returnees remembered the VI (doodlebug) which came down close to the town. The "Dads Army" were formed to prevent panic and set up roadblocks in the event of invasion and were only to be light fighters. Two machine gun bunkers were built to safeguard Portholme meadow, one of which is still to be seen, the other said to have been blown up more recently by senior pupils at Hinchingbrooke School. One spy who parachuted and broke his ankle on landing was captured and sent to Brixton. Later he was tried and was the last person to be executed in the Tower of London. Roger showed extracts from the mostly boring ARP book (for clocking on and off). One entry referred RIP to Hitler as a Twerp - mild by today's vocabulary. The talk painted a picture of what it was like in the war days something which most people today have only talks like this to tell them how it was.

The next meeting will be on Monday 6 March 2023 with Chris Carr on 'Living on the edge –life in the bronze age'. Chris has always delivered fascinating talks. Come and join us to find out how much we have advanced in the last 2-3000 years



The Old Village Board School Trust

The OVBST was formed when the site of the old school was sold off and the school transferred to the new site in Humberdale Way. Some of the money was invested and the interest from that money can be used to give small grants to young people from Warboys to help with their education. Young people must live within the parish of Warboys or within half a mile of the parish boundary and should be aged less than 25 years. Grants can be used

- for the purchase of special educational materials like books or equipment for College or University
- to buy special tools needed by someone who is undergoing special training or starting out in a trade or craft
- to purchase special sporting equipment or musical instruments
- for educational travel to broaden the education and experience of young people
- to allow young people to undergo special training courses that may not otherwise be available to them

It can also be used by school and youth groups, e.g. sports, religious or uniformed groups in the Warboys area to provide equipment to further the education and development of local young people.


