WARBOYS CORONATION WEEK



A series of events were held in Warboys at the beginning of May to celebrate the momentous occasion of the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla. A Coronation themed fete on 1 May at Warboys Sports Field attracted an estimated footfall of approaching 1,000

people – adults and children. Services were held at both the Baptist and Parish Churches on 7 May and a Big Help Out volunteering event was held

Monday 8 May at the Royal Oak

The Coronation Fete itself was a hugely successful and enjoyable day, especially as the weather was very kind to us,





especially when compared to the actual day of the coronation. We had such a lot going on - a display of tractors from the last 7 decades, as well as vintage cars. We had 30 stalls to browse and buy as well as bouncy castles surrounding a small arena where we had displays of street dancing,

karate, boxing, performance dance and trampolining fitness Pat and Pam did a roaring trade with their hotdogs and burgers, Seniz's vegetarian and

curry option went down really well and the queue for Franks Ices remained long well into the afternoon. The Sports and Social Club also proved very popular.

The variety of stalls was amazing - it was an opportunity for each of them to raise money for their own



groups or charities – between them they raised at least another $\pounds1500$ on top of the monies raised by Warboys Community Association.

The raffle ticket sales alone were brilliant and totalled almost £2,220, all helped by some really good prizes. The overall amount raised after all the bills were paid amounted to £2800, but we know that we will also be receiving another £2250 from the Vibrant Community Fund (thanks to Warboys Parish Council) and this means we will have raised a massive £5000. All of this money will be returned to the community in various ways. So far the WCA officers have agreed to return £1250 to those 15 affiliated groups who helped to sell raffle tickets. This will leave a balance of £3800 and the WCA committee, which is made up of representatives of all affiliated groups, will be discussing how we use this money at their meeting in June. A proportion will be added to the WCA grant fund which helps affiliated groups with monetary support, if and when they need a financial helping hand and some will be used to help fund the Warboys Diary print costs which have risen considerable over the last six months.

Lastly, we all hope you enjoyed the day and all being well we will see you all again next year for the May Day Community Fete on 6 May 2024 – same time, same place!

WARBOYS PARISH NEWS and UPDATES

Vandalism at Onyetts Field

Unfortunately, Onyetts Field which was purchased by the Parish Council to provide public open space has been the scene of substantial vandalism in recent weeks. Planting to commemorate the Queen's Jubilee was damaged and



supporting canes burnt and a footbridge was completely destroyed. The incidents have been reported to the Police and the Parish Council has invested in CCTV cameras that will be deployed periodically to deter future vandalism and identify anyone engaging in acts of vandalism.

Proposed Thermal Treatment Facility – Warboys Landfill Site

Following the refusal of planning permission by Cambridgeshire County Council for a waste energy recovery and transfer station at the Envar site at Woodhurst, the application for a Thermal Treatment Facility at Warboys landfill site is still outstanding. The proposed buildings would be larger than those proposed at Woodhurst and has been recommended for refusal by the Parish Council.

Details can be found on the County Council's website and members of the public wishing to object can do so by e-mailing the minerals and waste planning authority on <u>planningdc@cambridgeshire.gov.uk</u>.

Field site which would provide a status report in terms of how good it currently is for nature and provide recommendations on how to improve Biodiversity. The project also would fund the implementation of those recommendations.

The Vibrant Communities Fund

The Parish Council has successfully bid for a grant of £5,000 from the Fund that will help offset the costs of Feast Week, the Coronation events and the Christmas Lights Switch-on.

The money is part of a programme funded by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing & Communities to promote growth and sustainability after the pandemic.


Following delays on the part of the District Council in answering a Freedom of Information request for information about the proposal, the matter has been referred by the Parish Council to the Information Commissioner's Office.

animals, each child was presented with a special rosette. They all had a fabulous experience and came back to class wanting to make their own farms!

Our EYFS class also had the opportunity to explore a real tractor and discover how tractors help farmers - they even had a visit from a real lamb! We learned why lambs have coloured markings sprayed on them, what they eat and how often, how

big they grow and a special trick to help them feed. Thank you to Nancy's mum and dad who shared their farming knowledge with us.





Warboys Speedwatch Group

Volunteers run sessions and are

organised by a coordinator. Sessions usually run for 60-90 minutes with a minimum of 3 volunteers. Volunteers record the details of speeding vehicles, and this info is then sent to the Cambridgeshire Constabulary. Volunteers are trained by Cambridgeshire Constabulary with initial virtual training online followed by 'hands on' roadside training and are insured under a Cambridgeshire

Constabulary indemnity policy. Warboys is also fortunate to have our own camera equipment provided and maintained by the Parish Council.

Our most recent 80-minute session was on Friday morning 12 May 2023 on Church Road, starting 7.45 hours. During this period we counted 132 vehicles entering into the village from the airfield and A14. We noted 19 of those vehicles speeding and we have reported 18 vehicles for speeding up to 40 mph in the 30-mph zone. One of the vehicles was also found to be untaxed since 1st February 2023.

Thanks as always to our volunteer team members who got up early and gave up part of their Friday morning for the benefit of our village community.


