GENERAL COMMUNITY NEWS

A farewell and thank you to Mary and Peter Bucknell



A couple who have contributed greatly to life in Warboys will be sadly leaving the village shortly. Peter and Mary Bucknell arrived in the village in 1998 and lost no time in taking an active part in the local community. Mary was elected to the Parish Council in May 2005 and was Chairman from September 2011 until she decided not to stand for re-election in May 2018. Peter was elected to Huntingdonshire District Council in 2002 until deciding also to not stand for re-

election at the same time as Mary. Peter served as Chairman of the District Council for two years and was Cabinet portfolio holder for planning for many years.

In their civic roles, they both played a prominent and active part in promoting the interests of Warboys and its residents. While rarely missing a meeting, they were always available to do their best to resolve any questions or complaints that were raised with them by the public often at weekends or evenings. As a senior member of the District Council, Peter was able to offer invaluable advice to the Parish Council on issues that affected the village and to promote the interests of Warboys at District level.

Within the Parish Council, Mary was instrumental in obtaining a large grant of £100,000 to install new play equipment at Adams Lyons in 2011 which has made it one of the best equipped and well-visited playgrounds in the vicinity. As a result of a rise in anti-social behaviour a few years ago, both Mary and Peter were involved in meetings with the Police and County Council Youth Service which resulted in the popular Friday night visits by the Connections Bus to the village. Mary was also responsible for promoting the Timebank scheme in Warboys, although this sadly did not prove to be as popular as anticipated.

Outside the Council, Mary was a founder member and one of the principal supporters of the Christmas Lighting Group. Its small group of committed enthusiasts have worked hard to generate funding and sponsorship for the extensive lighting display, Christmas tree and switch-on event which are enjoyed by so many residents. She was also involved in the Poppy Appeal to be found selling poppies door to door for many years.

Warboys and its residents owe Peter and Mary a huge debt of gratitude for the enormous time and energy that they have devoted to the community during their time in the village and we wish them the very best wishes for the future as they move to be closer to their family.

Announcement and new appointments for Warboys Parish Council

Recent Successes

- The Parish Council has been successful in securing funding from Cambridge and Peterborough Combined Authority for biodiversity projects. The council nominated Onyett's Field where a biodiversity sciencebased audit has been carried out; currently we are awaiting the results to identify where funding would be most beneficial to the natural environment that Onyett's Field boasts.
- A new 40mph speed limit has been approved at the top of Station Road and along Puddock Road including gateways with signage going up imminently. This new measure should improve safety for both users and residents using these roads.

OUR NEW PARISH CENTRE

We are really pleased to announce that things are progressing quickly for the new Parish Centre development. At this time, we are working very hard to secure funds through the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) - Public Works Loan Board to ensure we make the most of this opportunity to provide a Parish Centre we can all be proud of.

Warboys Parish Council members' wish to consult with residents on raising the Parish precept in order to help cover the additional cost of borrowing from the Public Works Loan Board (loan of 450K). This loan will complete the finance required to build residents a Parish Centre of real quality - a building that will provide space for community activities and for residents to hire for celebrations with family and friends, baby showers, kids parties and life goodbyes.

So the first question which will be asked by residents is how much? Our current estimation is that the Precept may rise approximately 52 pence per week per household (about the same as a Mars bar)! We are exploring every alternative through grant funding in order to keep the increase as low as possible.

This year's walk-in flu clinics are scheduled for the following dates:

Saturday 7 October 2023

- 8am 12 noon for 65-year-olds and over
- 1.30 3.30 pm for 18-64-year-olds at risk and pregnant women

Saturday 21 October 2023

- 8am-12 noon for 65-year-olds and over
- 1:30 -3 .30 for 18-64-year-olds at risk and pregnant women

If you are unsure if you are eligible, please ask a member of our team.

We aim for the clinics to run as smoothly as possible and request that you wear clothing that easily exposes your upper arm.

Booking Appointments

When booking an appointment at the surgery our receptionists will ask for a brief description of the problem. The only reason the receptionist asks for this information is to ensure that you are directed to the correct clinician. We respectfully ask that you give as much detail as you can.

BP Monitors

We continue to loan blood pressure monitors to patients to enable them to monitor their bp over a week. However, the loan machines are not always returned to the surgery. Please could we ask if you have had a BP machine recently and have forgotten to return it, that you do so as soon as possible.

Online Patient Triage

As of Wednesday 4 October 2023 the Moat House Surgery will 'go live' with our new online consultation patient triage. This is a great way for patients to contact our practice for medical or admin requests. It is very simple to fill out so please do give it a go if you need to contact us. Please try and give as much specific and concise information as possible.

We really think it is easier for most people than waiting on hold to speak to a receptionist. If you do not have access to the internet or find it difficult to use a computer or smartphone you can still call reception who will run through the form with you on the phone and complete on your behalf.

You may also be contacted by a local NHS service, such as your GP surgery, to get a vaccine for you or your child. This is usually done by text or a phone call, but you may sometimes get a letter or a notification in the NHS App.

WARBOYS LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

Joe Whistlecraft the poacher who got away with murder.


At the August meeting Pip Wright assured us that the title of his talk was not an idiom, but a reality. Joe Whistlecraft did commit murder and got away with it.

Born into a large family in rural Suffolk, Joe learnt all the poacher's basic crafts, e.g. how to shoot, snare, train a dog, fight, and know when to run and hide. His father was frequently in prison, so it is not surprising that coming from such a family, Joe was often in trouble. His first prison experience was when he was arrested being drunk and disorderly, threatening a police officer, and being unable to pay the fine was sentenced to 8 days in prison. Though apprehensive, his father told him about his first time in prison when, determined to cope, told himself, 'I can knock it out.'

Further prosecutions followed, (failing to pay a dog licence, assault, robbery and arson, the latter resulting in 3 years in Chelmsford prison). One of his brothers died in prison whilst another turned from on crime and 'went straight'. On the outbreak of World War I, Joe remained at home, unable to enlist because he was missing two fingers after a shotgun accident. It was during this time, during tensions between Joe and his father that he shot his father in the back. The charge of attempted murder was reduced to unlawful wounding and resulted in 18 months hard labour.

In 1929 Joe faced a more serious charge. Together with his younger brother Ernie, he went poaching in Stubbing's Wood, on the Wilson estate. On a dark and wet evening, Joe fired his shotgun randomly into the trees in the hope of hitting some birds, but this caught the attention the gamekeeper Cornwell. Although Ernie picked up a bird and ran off, Joe was slowed by the muddy conditions. Suddenly a spotlight shone into his face. Joe fired at the light to put it out and fled. Later, he was arrested and charged with murder, but his barrister undermined the prosecution's evidence, and he was acquitted.

Having 'got away with murder', Joe kept a low profile. During World War II, Major Wilson approached him to become his gamekeeper. The poacher became gamekeeper! Although described as a 'wrong 'un', Joe became crime free, only bagging the odd rabbit for the pot during his official duties. He died aged 84 in 1960.



The next meeting on 2 October will be "Ramsey Then and Now" by Martyn Smith. This will be the last of the season and we will be in recess until March 2024

We have enjoyed welcoming our older children back to preschool this term and meeting new friends as we are joined by the younger ones. They have all settled in incredibly well and have






