Want to find out how much heat you're losing from your home and save money?

In December and January, the Warboys Climate and Environment Group (WCEG) will be offering Warboys homeowners the opportunity to find out how much heat - and so money and fossil fuels - their homes could be losing.

If your home is losing heat through the roof, windows, doors, or walls, you'll be using more energy than you need. Not only does this cost more with increased fuel prices, but it's also burning more fossil fuels, which in turn, puts more carbon into the atmosphere and warms the Earth. Even in Warboys we're seeing some of the effects of this in the more extreme weather events we've been experiencing.

Using a state-of-the-art thermal imaging camera, which captures heat images using colours to show hot, warm, and cold spots, we'll be able to pinpoint where heat is being lost in homes. This will help householders to really focus their efforts on the places where increased insulation could make a big difference and so reduce energy consumption.

The WCEG team, who have all been trained in the use of the thermal cameras to carry out the surveys, will also signpost to resources that can help, for example in increasing insulation or stopping draughts.

How it will work

Between 11-14 December 2023 and 8-11 January 2024, members of the Warboys Climate and Environment Group will be borrowing a thermal imaging camera from Cambridge Carbon Footprint to carry out surveys for village households.

- we can only carry out a limited number of surveys during the evenings of each week that the camera is available, so we'll be operating on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Each survey will take around 30 minutes and the team will need access to the outside of your home, including garden spaces.
- We'll share the survey findings with you as we go, and we'll be in touch a few weeks after the survey to find out how things have progressed for you.

Community Autumn Litter Pick

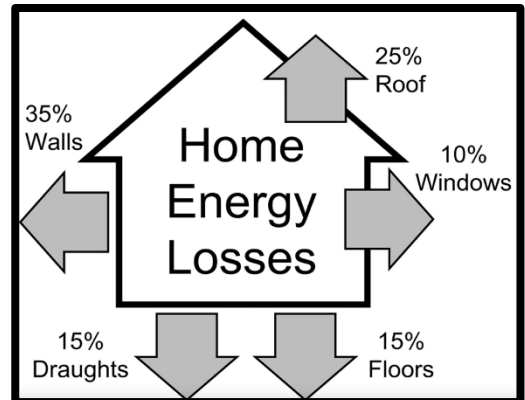

Did you know that WOVBST can provide financial grants to help with educational costs?

Do you live in Warboys? Need help with your education? Could a grant help you? Or do you belong to a village youth group that needs better equipment to further the education and development of young people?

Young people must live within the parish of Warboys or within half a mile of the parish boundary and must be aged less than 25 years. It can be used for:

- Special educational materials like books or equipment for college or university
- Special tools or equipment needed for undergoing specific training or starting out in a craft or trade
- Special sporting equipment or musical instruments
- Education travel to broaden the education and experience of young people
- To allow young people to undergo special training courses that may not otherwise be available to them.

WARBOYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

We hope that you will join us all in thanking Roy Reeves, who officially retired from his position as Parish Clerk in November, for his unrivalled passion and dedication given to Warboys over the past 27 years.

The Council Members also send their deepest condolences to the family of John Rignall, who has sadly passed away. He served as a well-respected Chairman of Warboys Parish Council from 1985 to 1989.

As 2023 draws to a close the Parish Council Members are able to reflect on the successes and achievements from the last 12 months. Just a few of the highlights:

Road Safety

- Station Road: A 40 mph buffer zone is now in place when approaching the village via Station Road.
- A141: Highways have approved crossing signs and hedge cutting to improve visibility and awareness for users crossing the A141 from Wilthorne to Onyett's field. More work is in progress to further improve the safety of this crossing.
- Ramsey Road: The Council are in the process of putting an application forward to Highways for traffic calming measures to be introduced along Ramsey Road. Due to the hard work from several concerned residents, we have high hopes for a successful bid.

King's Coronation Events

- A series of events were held in Warboys at the beginning of May to celebrate the momentous occasion of the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla. Thanks to a generous donation from Swannells Transport a new commemorative bench was installed on the High Street.

Queen's Green Canopy

- As a final part of the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations Swannells Transport and the Dykstra family each kindly donated a new Oak tree, both were planted alongside a variety of native trees and hedging plants at Onyett's Field, providing more homes and food for our wildlife.

OUR NEW PARISH CENTRE

We are delighted to say that following our precept consultation there was overwhelming support for a new Parish Centre as well as the proposed increase in precept to help fund the build. Those that raised concerns in their responses please be assured that they will be taken into account as the project moves forward.

Almost everything is now in place for the builders to commence work on our New Parish Centre, which has been thoughtfully designed to be environmentally friendly and energy efficient whilst accommodating Warboys growing needs.

Changes to Green Bin Waste Collection

Huntingdonshire District Council's Cabinet Members have agreed to introduce a fortnightly garden waste (Green Bin) subscription service that will come into effect in April 2024. This will mean that the current free service for green bin collection will end 31 March 2024.

The cost of the service will be £57.50 per annum for one garden waste bin, additional bins will be £30 each. There will be an option for neighbours to share bins which should help to reduce the cost impact on residents.

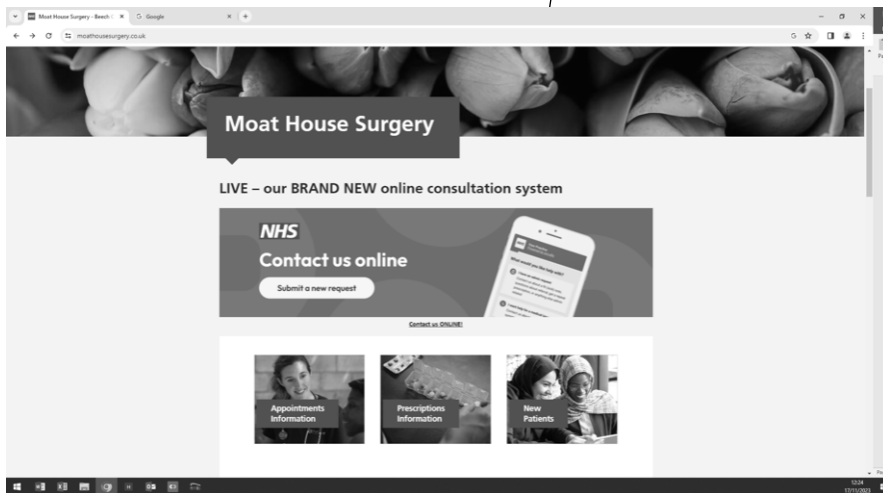

New Team Members

We are very excited to welcome our **new GP Partner, Dr Catherine Salkield**, who joined the surgery on the 4 September 2023. Catherine will be at the practice all day Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.

A new health care assistant, Emma Griffiths, joins the team, who will give us greater capacity for blood test appointments.

New Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Richard Nash, will work alongside our GPs and our existing Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Chloe Fazakerley, triaging and offering long term conditions clinics. Both Richard and Chloe are highly trained health professionals that can undertake complex reviews of patients, similar to a GP. They can assess symptoms and build a picture of a patients condition, treat minor health problems, infections, minor injuries and prescribe medication.

Emma Young has joined the Social Prescribing Link Workers Team. This role is a fairly new one which you may not be familiar with. Social prescribing is an approach that connects patients to activities, groups and services in their community to meet practical, social and emotional needs that affect their health and wellbeing.

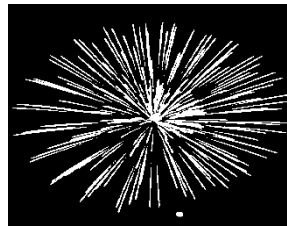

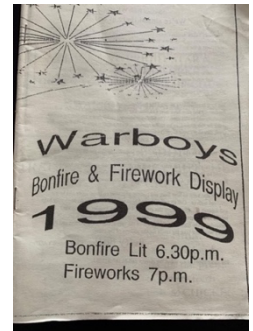
Where it all began

The bonfire & fireworks all began when the Warboys children needed somewhere to meet and have fun, Pat and myself both had children of the right age to need this, so we got involved with the Warboys Youth Action Group which was headed by Dave & Betty Ball. We wanted to help



fund raise to convert part of the library at the back, into a youth club, later to be called the "Youthie". Pat and I came up with the idea of the Fireworks



and set about finding a venue. At Warboys School May Ball, we had a chat with Richard Stokes, and he kindly offered us Tythe Farm, which was totally viable, and we held our first Bonfire & Fireworks event in 1994.

When the "Youthie" closed Pat and I renamed the event Warboys Community Bonfire & Fireworks. Our aim was to raise as much money as possible and give all profits back to Warboys Community at later date. We put together a programme and sold advertising space. This was very successful. We have been very lucky to have gained sponsorship from many local companies some of which have been our supporters since the beginning and have stuck with us, and for this we thank them.

Over the years the Stokes family have taken more of an active role in setting up, building the bonfire, and clearing the site. We are extremely grateful for this because without their support the event would not have been able to run for as long.

FRIENDS OF WARBOYS LIBRARY (FOWL)

You may well have seen snippets in other Diary issues about the Friends of Warboys Library (FOWL), but we want to raise our profile. FOWL is a group of volunteers who support the library staff in developing the service and raising awareness of the facilities offered by the Library. There is so much more to do than just borrow a book (although of course you can do that as well)! For example, did you know we hold:

- coffee mornings every Saturday, where you can come and have a cuppa, a biscuit, and a natter, all for a small donation towards the cost of your refreshment.
- regular book sales, to raise funds to support the library. you can fill a whole bag of books for just a few pounds.
- regular social events for the Friends and volunteers

Also

- Each month FOWL purchases a number of top 10 books, just for Warboys to retain in their circulation
- If you have any recent books that you have bought, read, and enjoyed, then sometimes the Library Service will accept these as donations that go straight to the Warboys library, just for the residents of Warboys.
- The choice and range of books, we hold as a small library, is really very impressive.
- We support the Summer Reading Challenge
- Some of our volunteers help out the library staff with their daily tasks – a lovely way to spend a few hours if you're a book nerd!

The Summer Reading Challenge this year was very popular, with around 80 children taking part. We are grateful to the Parish Council and the Old Village School Board Trust for their sponsorship of this event.

We have held two successful book and cake sales and coffee mornings, one in June and one in September, both raising a good amount for FOWL to continue supporting the library. With a whole bag of books for £2, many came along to sort out their winter reading. There were definitely fewer boxes of books at the end of the sale than the beginning which was very welcome for the volunteers carrying them in and out!

WARBOYS WI

After a summer break from regular meetings, we were thrilled to have Dr Peter D Clarkson MBE to speak about his 'Life in Antarctica'. His experiences of living in an underground camp with 5 other men over a two-year period in the late 1960's were explained with humour and illustrated by some stunning slides. 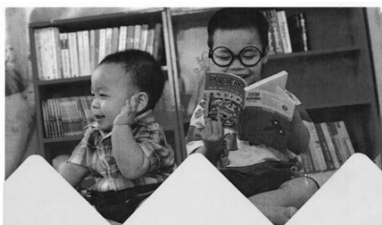

Cambridgeshire County Council has launched an online fall risk checking tool to help you understand your risk of falling and simple steps you can take to stay active and independent.

From the age of 65, the risk of having a fall increases but many are avoidable. The new tool, Steady on your Feet, is aimed at those who haven't previously had a fall but would like to understand what they can do to prevent this happening.

Steady on Your Feet is easy to use, asking a short series of questions to help understand any individual risks you might have and providing an action plan to keep you active and independent while increasing your confidence and reducing the risk of falling. You can fill it in yourself, or ask a family member or friend if you need extra help.
